Coptic Lesson 11: The Rule of the JINKIM { }

The Jinkim is the accent mark that is placed on Coptic letters to indicate pronunciation.

The Rule:

I. When Jinkim comes over a vowel letter, it splits the word, because the letter must be pronounced by itself.

The Coptic vowel letters:

(English)	Α	Е			0		U
(Coptic)	λ	ϵ	Н	-	0	r	w

Examples

II. When JINKIM comes over a consonant letter, an e sound proceeds the letter.

For Example:

$$K = \epsilon K$$
 $M = \epsilon M$ $N = \epsilon N$ $\lambda = \epsilon \lambda$
