**What does the message
“Christ Crucified” entail?**

1. The old man should be crucified, so we are to be freed

“Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin”

Romans 6:3,6

2. To live Crucified, so that the Lord Christ can live in us

**“I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who
live, but Christ lives in me”**

Galatians 2:20

3. The Joy is in what is after the Cross not in avoiding it

“looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our
faith, who for the joy that was set before Him
endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat
down at the right hand of the throne of God”

Hebrews 12:2

4. The Cross is our pride and its suffering is what we bring with us on Judgment Day
