
A Mission for All

Apostles or All Believers?


- Apostles and disciples received the same mission
- The Lord Christ identifies Himself with those who share the message of the gospel
- "He who hears you hears Me, he who rejects you rejects Me, and he who rejects Me rejects Him who sent Me." (Luke 10:16)
- "For thus says the Lord God: 'Indeed I Myself will search for My sheep and seek them out. As a shepherd seeks out his flock on the day he is among his scattered sheep, so will I seek out My sheep and deliver them from all the places where they were scattered on a cloudy and dark day." (Ezekiel 34:11-12)

- 1. To preach the kingdom and heal the sick
- "He sent them to preach the kingdom of God and to heal the sick." (Luke 9:2)
- "Therefore, when the Lord knew that the Pharisees had heard that Jesus made and baptized more disciples than John (though Jesus Himself did not baptize, but His disciples)." (John 4:1-2)
- "Do not go into the way of the Gentiles, and do not enter a city of the Samaritans. But go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." (Matt. 10:5-6)
- "So they departed and went through the towns, preaching the gospel and healing everywhere." (Luke 9:6)

- Healing the sick?
 - "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also..." (John 14:12)
 - Miracles are not necessary for preaching
 - It was a tool



- 2. Make disciples of all nations
- Disciples or followers?
- His ultimate desire is for ALL nations



3. Teach them

- Teaching is a responsibility of every believer whether they accept is willfully or not
- "Yes, woe is me if I do not preach the gospel! For if I do this willingly, I have a reward; but if against my will, I have been entrusted with a stewardship."
 (1 Cor. 9:16-17)

Identity of a Disciple

1. Conviction

- "Yes, woe is me if I do not preach the gospel. For if I do this willingly, I have a reward; but if against my will, I have been entrusted with a stewardship." (1 Cor. 9:16-17)
- "One person with conviction is the majority."
 (John Maxwell)

Identity of a Disciple

2. Self-Sacrifice

- "Do we have no right to eat and drink? Do we have no right to take along a believing wife, as do also the other apostles, the brothers of the Lord, and Cephas? Or is it only Barnabas and I who have no right to refrain from working? Who ever goes to war at his own expense? Who plants a vineyard and does not eat of its fruit? Or who tends a flock and does not drink of the milk of the flock?" (1 Cor. 9:4-7)
- "Take nothing for the journey, neither staffs nor bag nor bread nor money; and do not have two tunics apiece." (Luke 9:3)

Identity of a Disciple

- 3. Focus on the prize
- "What is my reward then? That when I preach the gospel, I may present the gospel of Christ without charge, that I may not abuse my authority in the gospel." (1 Cor. 9:18)
- "I have become all things to all men, that I might by all means save some. Now this I do for the gospel's sake, that I may be partaker of it with you." (1 Cor. 9:22-23)

How to pursue the prize?

- Temperate in all thing
 - "And everyone who competes for the prize is temperate in all things." (1 Cor. 9:25)
- With certainty
 - "Therefore I run thus: not with uncertainty. Thus I fight: not as one who beats the air." (1 Cor. 9:26)
 - Targeted and purposeful
- Abide by the rules
 - "But I discipline my body and bring it into subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become disqualified." (1 Cor. 9:27)

Conclusion

- Our mission is...

 - Conviction
