
INTRODUCTION

INTRODUCTION

- Satan attacks mankind on three primary fronts:
 - Body
 - Ego
 - Possessions
 - All sins are rooted in one of the above
- The Lord Christ promises a reward to those who embark on this journey



WHY REWARD US?

- "...and your Father who sees in secret will Himself reward you openly." (Matt. 6:4,6,18)
- Who benefits from our pursuit of righteousness?
- Encouragement
- Invokes seriousness

THE REWARD IS CERTAIN

- Persecution
 - "Rejoice and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you." (Matt. 5:12)
- Cup of cold water
 - "And whoever gives one of these little ones only a cup of cold water in the name of a disciple, assuredly, I say to you, he shall by no means lose his reward." (Matt. 10:42)

THE REWARD IS CERTAIN

- For the workers
 - "And while they [foolish virgins] went to buy, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went in with him to the wedding; and the door was shut." (Matt. 25:10)



THE REWARD IS CERTAIN

- His promise
 - "When you give a dinner or a supper, do not ask your friends, your brothers, your relatives, nor rich neighbors, lest they also invite you back, and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind. And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you; for you shall be repaid at the resurrection of the just." (Lk. 14:12-14)
 - "And behold, I am coming quickly, and My reward is with Me, to give to every one according to his work." (Rev. 22:12)

WHAT IS OUR REWARD?

- Difference between Old Testament and New Testament rewards
- EX: Abraham
- "After these things the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, saying, "Do not be afraid, Abram. I am your shield, your exceedingly great reward." But Abram said, "Lord God, what will You give me, seeing I go childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus." (Gen. 15:1-2)

- 2. Increased responsibility
 - "For to everyone who has, more will be given, and he will have abundance; but from him who does not have, even what he has will be taken away."

 (Matt. 25:29)
