- “Therefore, since a promise remains of entering His rest, let us fear lest any of you seem to have come short of it” **Hebrews 4:1**



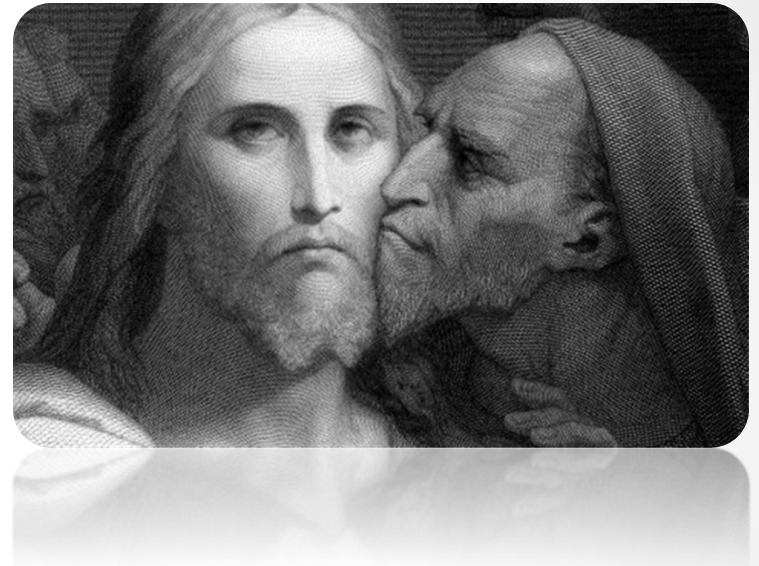

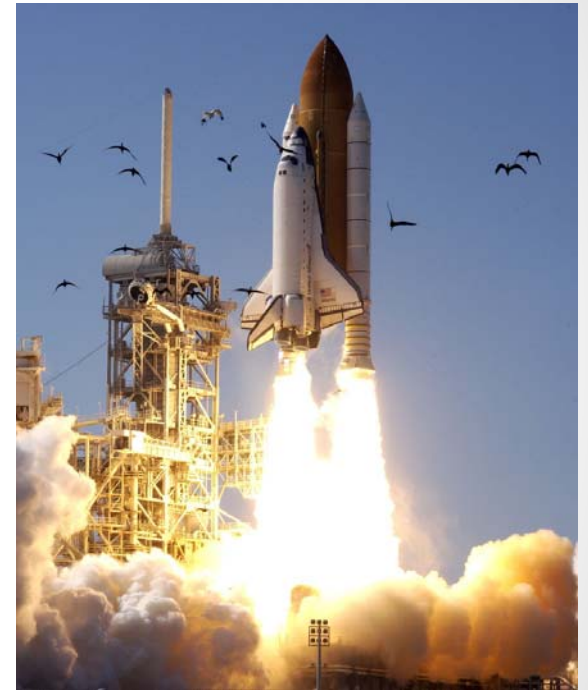

Stumbling on the road ⁽¹⁾

1. Running out of fuel:

- The nature of the emotions and their short lives
- Absence of the consolation with the long way



Stumbling on the road ⁽²⁾

2. Forgetting the promises

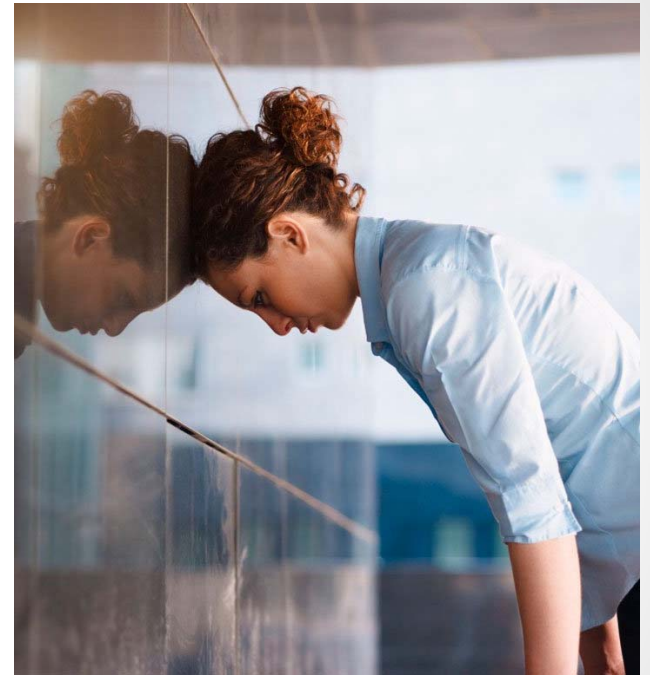
- The Israelites and their turning away from their promises
- Promises are made for actions not for feelings
- Promises are not conditioned



Stumbling on the road ⁽³⁾

3. Frustration:

- The long way
- Tiredness: “And let us not grow weary while doing good” ***Galatians 6:9***
- Daily responsibilities and life demands
- Unmet expectations



Stumbling on the road ⁽⁴⁾

3. Frustration: (Cont.)

- Absence of fruits or return on the investment
- Doubts



Stumbling on the road ⁽⁵⁾

4. Strange love

- Love of the world (Demas)
- Money, pleasures
- The idol of the ego (Saul, King Uzziah)



Stumbling on the road ⁽⁶⁾

5. Boredom

- "...and our soul loathes this worthless bread"

Numbers 21:5

- Traveling in the wilderness
- The liturgy, the Agpeya, the church, etc.



Stumbling on the road ⁽⁷⁾

6. Relying on uncertain sources of fuel

- Appreciation, rewards, promotion
- Individuals (Moses and his absence)
- New tastes and experience



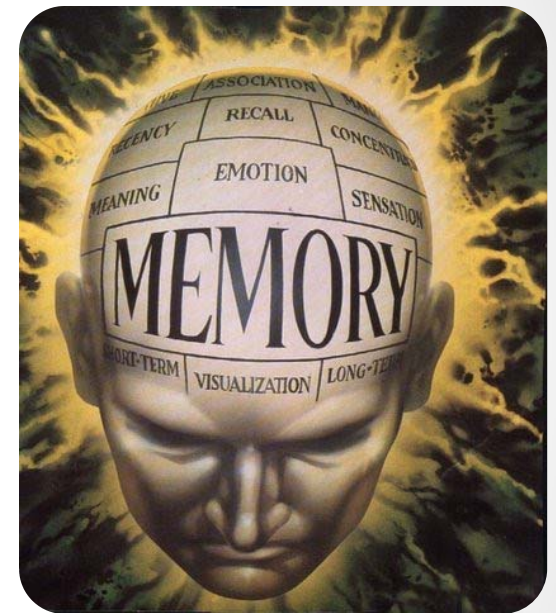
Stumbling on the road ⁽⁸⁾

7. The selective memory

- Remembering only the negatives, setbacks and hurts
- Lacking the ability to forgive

8. Looking for early comforts:

- The nature of the way does not permit vacations or retirement



Stumbling on the road ⁽⁹⁾

9. Emotional withdrawal

- Remembering Egypt and seeking to return back
- Seeking comforts through what is seen and felt
- Spending time in social activities to avoid confronting
- the real problem



Enduring to the end ⁽¹⁾

1. Understanding the nature of the race

- Setting the right expectations and how to deal with them
- Understanding God's will, myself, others, the course, the common stumbles, etc.



Enduring to the end ⁽²⁾

2. Faith vs. comforts

- The wars of boredom and distractions are confronted with a strong faith in God's acceptance
- Storing the experiences in the days of comfort to use them in the days of aridity



Enduring to the end ⁽³⁾

3. The new forms of love

- Success is not measured by how we feel
- Endurance, respect, commitment are all forms of love that fit the nature of a long path

4. Living with the mind of a servant

- *The burden of the stewardship:*

“For if I do this willingly, I have a reward; but if against my will, I have been entrusted with a stewardship” **1 Cor. 9:17**

- *It is more blessed to give:*

“And I will very gladly spend and be spent for your souls; though the more abundantly I love you, the less I am loved” **2 Cor 12:15**

- *Accepting the loss:*

“...for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain

Christ” ***Philippians 3:8***
