
Our Need for Silence and Solitude

Introduction

- "For whoever shall keep the whole law, and yet stumble in one point, he is guilty of all." (Jam. 2:10)
- The purpose is to separate ourselves from the distractions of life (mind and heart) with the purpose of meeting with God.



Is it necessary?

"Truly my soul silently waits for God; from Him comes my salvation." (Ps. 62:1)

"Be still, and know that I am God..." (Ps. 46:10)



Is it necessary?

"A life without a quiet center easily becomes delusional. When we cling to the results of our actions as our only way of self-identification, we become possessive, defensive, and dependent on false identities. In the solitude of prayer, we slowly unmask the illusion of our dependencies and possessiveness, and discover in the center of our own self that we are not what we can control or conquer but what is given us from above to channel to others. In solitary prayer we become aware that our identity does not depend on what we have accomplished or possess, that our productivity does not define us, and that our worth is not the same as our usefulness." (Henri Nouwen)

- "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord!" (Lk. 5:8)




1. To know yourself

- To know our weakness
- Weakness is a point in our life that is present, but weak.
- It is refining something good to be better.



2. Allows us to hear God's voice

"...and after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a still small voice." (1 Kings 19:12)



3. Creates an environment that aides wise decision-making

 - Death, judgment, and the afterlife

 - "Behold, I am about to stand before the just judge terrified and trembling because of my many sins." (12th Hour Litany, Agpeya)
 - Lives of Saints
