


Things to remember about the virtue of being "Rasponsibla"

 Genesis 2:23


David's fight with a bear and a lion to save a sheep

- Unless responsibility is owned towards all of these aspects, change and corrections will not be possible




III. It is the way to mature ownership (2)

- It expands from serving a certain aspect of a human life to caring for the person from every side

- It develops from an attitude of a godly servant to the ultimate level of fatherhood




V. It is never dependent on feelings or favorable circumstances (1)
